Interchange ramp to open this year

he eastbound off-ramp of the Pāpāmoa East Interchange will open ahead of schedule and is expected to be operational in the second half of this year.

The news has been welcomed by residents, who were originally given a date of mid-2026 for the completion of the full $\,$ interchange project.

However questions remain about toll charges. Bay of Plenty MP Tom Rutherford says work is continuing on consideration of a new toll point west of the interchange.

"While there are still details to be worked through regarding tolling, the priority has rightly been placed on delivering tangible benefits to residents as quickly as possible. I encourage locals to participate in the public consultation on tolling arrangements expected in mid-2025," says Tom.

The interchange is a critical infrastructure project for the Pāpāmoa area, which is projected to grow to around 40,000 people by 2043. Once completed, it will significantly reduce travel times to Tauranga, Mount Maunganui, and eastern destinations while facilitating further development of the Golden Sands and Wairākei neighbourhoods and The Sands town centre.

Tom says the early opening is a victory for the rapidly growing community, and will improve commuter journeys and open up more land for development and growth.

"I've been advocating for this project since before I became an MP as locals repeatedly tell me that it is important to them.'

The interchange project is a joint initiative between Tauranga City Council and the NZ Transport Agency, with NZTA providing 51 percent of the funding. HEB Construction is leading the construction work.

Tom praised the collaboration between local and central government.

"Projects like this help to deliver economic growth that ultimately provides more jobs, higher incomes and further opportunities to help families get ahead.

"I want to thank the Minister, Tauranga City Council, and NZTA for their commitment to this project and their willingness to find innovative ways to accelerate its delivery. This is exactly the kind of practical, common-sense approach to infrastructure that our region needs."

Tauranga City Council says forecasts also show an opportunity for \$5 million to be saved on the cost of the project. which is currently budgeted for \$79.3 million in the Long-

At a meeting of the council's City Future Committee, it was shared that the project is being delivered on time, on

The committee heard that there have been more than 80,000 worker hours on site to date without any serious harm incidents.

"This is exactly what we're looking for – projects that are going to improve the social and economic wellbeing of our communities, while offering value for money for our ratepayers, and ensuring that our workers go home safe to their families every day," says committee chair Rod Taylor. ■

Naomi wins gold at Australian surf event

has won gold in the Masters Female Surf Race at the Australian National Championships.

The 53-year-old Pāpāmoa Surf Life Saving Club member competed against 15 of Australia's top athletes, leading from the outset and holding her position through challenging surf conditions. Facing strong currents, a heavy shore break, and a $demanding\ second\ bank,\ she\ demonstrated\ both$ skill and determination to claim victory.

Naomi, who is a Life Member of the Pāpāmoa Surf Club and a teacher at Golden Sands School, says the competition at the event was next level.

"I knew I had to push hard from the start. I managed to lead around the first can with a group in close pursuit," says Naomi.

"Heading back in, I feared getting jagged, but I fought hard to be first on the wave - and the rest is history! I'm stoked with the result - all the swimming paid off."

Pāpāmoa Surf Club says Naomi's achievement is a source of immense pride for both the club and the wider New Zealand surf lifesaving community. Her success on the international stage is a testament to

the strength and talent of Kiwi athletes in surf sports, says the club.

Naomi's twin daughters Isobella and Georgia Davoren also competed at the event, finishing in 6th place in the U19 Female Tube Rescue final together with teammates Trelise Chote and Amelie

The Australian Surf Life Saving Championships, affectionately known as "The Aussies," is the premier event in the surf lifesaving calendar, bringing together members from Australia's 314 surf clubs to compete in over 480 beach and ocean events. More than 7000 competitors entered this year's Gold Coast event. The competition included traditional lifesaving disciplines like rescue and resuscitation, belt swimming, and surf boats, to modern ironman and ironwoman races, which encompass swimming, running, surf ski paddling, and paddle

The award is named after the late Alan Cotter, and recognises individuals whose dedication to cricket has shaped their communities for the better.

Alan's legacy was built on selfless service, tireless commitment, and a belief that "if everyone does their bit in the community, then the community is a better place for it."

Bay of Plenty Cricket says that like Alan Cotter, Mark has a strong passion not only for club cricket but for the local community.

very Wednesday morning at 6am, a little

bit of magic happens at Pāpāmoa Domain People of all ages, and from all walks of life,

come together to take a dip in the ocean winter, summer, rain, hail, or shine - and begin their day on a high.

It all started three years ago when Jacinda Crothers came up with the idea as an opportunity to connect with nature and other people in the community.

"I've done this for years now; I used to do it on my own," says Jacinda. "It's a shared experience now, which is beautiful. It's totally open to everybody. It's such an incredibly

magical way to start the day."

The 'Rise and Refresh' ritual is much more than a morning swim. Jacinda, who is a certified mindfulness mentor and expansion coach, says it's about building resilience, showing up for yourself, and supporting mental health. The group meets on the beach by the domain carpark, Jacinda lights a candle, and they do a mindfulness practice before braving the waves.

As the seasons change, cooler mornings and wild weather bring swims that can be even more magical than on a beautiful summer's day, says Jacinda.

"Every Wednesday is different as we

journey through the seasons. It's different every single day, that's why I have thousands of photos. The sky is different, the moon is different, the waves are different.

"We do it over summer and that's easy, but as the seasons shift, there's a different focus. All of a sudden I'm out of my comfort zone, it's dark, it's cold, but we walk through it together."

Jacinda has committed to a personal challenge to swim in the ocean every day for a year; when we spoke to her she was up to day 87.

"These next few months are going to be challenging, but that's where the growth happens," she says. "It's easy when the water is warm and it's beautiful outside. But if you can show up for yourself in these moments, feel the fear and do it anyway, on the other side of that is where there is massive growth."

Pāpāmoa is home to Jacinda and her family after spending 15 years living overseas.

Enjoying the area's easy access to nature is a huge positive.

"I feel like we are so blessed to live where we are. To be able to access what we have from a nature perspective. There are people around the world who would pay millions of dollars to have what we have on our doorstep."

Jacinda hopes to inspire more people to embrace early swims and join her on Wednesday mornings.

"It's something that I'm so passionate about. I'd love to see more people from Pāpāmoa and surrounding areas discover this transformative experience. Everyone walks away and says 'look at that morning!' Before the sun rises, we have allowed ourselves to connect with nature. It's such a beautiful place."

Nature to art: an exhibition

Art brought Suzy Granger and Emma Davie together, and now the pair are excited to stage a combined exhibition.

When abstract painter Emma first admired Suzy's ceramics, she was surprised to learn that the artist lived on Simpson Rd, just round the corner from her own Dickson Rd home.

At the time Emma didn't realise that Suzy had already admired her work too, and had even visited Emma's studio during the BOP Open Studios art trail.

"I had to meet her," says Emma, who sent Suzy a message on Instagram and found an instant connection. "We had so much in common, we had very similar ethics."

Adds Suzy: "And our approach to our work, and the abstract nature of it."

A firm friendship was formed, which has culminated in an upcoming exhibition that's been a year in the making. Confluence (a conversation through canvas and clay), is at the Incubator gallery at Tauranga's Historic Village from 16 May to 7 June.

Confluence is the perfect name for the exhibition of two like-minded artists, describing the process or act of merging.

"[Confluence] is like when two rivers merge, it's like our work merging, and the environment and how we merge with it," explains Suzy, who creates under the name Slab Ceramics.

Both artists are heavily inspired by nature, and they say their intent for the show is a conversation between two

artists about the environment; land, nature, and sea.

Living in Pāpāmoa inspires both of their work. Emma arrived here eight years ago in the hope of a slower pace of life, while Suzy moved here five years ago. She decided to take six months off teaching to focus on her ceramics, and the risk paid off, with her work soon stocked at Paper Plane in the Mount.

Walking on the beach inspired the work Suzy is showing in the exhibition. "[Last winter] there was so much detritus and debris on the beach, there was so much colour. These colours, and textures, and shapes, have inspired the work."

Emma too likes to take slow walks on the beach, where she stops to photograph small details that catch her eye. "It's that really slowing down and looking, [you see details] like marks left on the beach made by seaweed."

They both hope that their work reminds people of something they have seen in the natural world, sparking imagination.

"It's the imperfect," says Emma. "That's part of going back to nature."

The exhibition is on at The Incubator Gallery (Historic Village) from 16 May to 7 June.



This low maintenance, delicious curry is the perfect addition to any dinner schedule! Fragrant and creamy, the house will be filled with the tantalizing scent of this moreish, slow cooked wonder. Garnish with fresh coriander and chilli to your own tastes, making it the perfect family friendly meal.

- 800g lamb neck or shoulder chops
- 15g butter
- 1 onion, thinly sliced
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1tsp minced ginger
- 150ml beef or lamb stock
- ¾ cup (or 200g) korma curry paste
- 1 cup cream
- 1/4 cup ground almonds
- 100g baby spinach
- Coriander, crispy curry leaves and chilli, to garnish
- · Rice and naan bread, to serve

Preheat your oven to 150 degrees celsius, fan bake. In a heavy based casserole dish, bring a drizzle of oil to a medium to high heat. Brown the lamb chops for 1-2 minutes each side, then set aside.

To the same dish, add the butter and stir until melted. Add the onion, garlic and ginger, and cook while stirring for 2-3 minutes or until the onion begins to soften. Stir through the curry paste and cook for a further minute.

Pour over the stock then stir and nestle the lamb chops into the onion mixture. Cover with a tight fitting lid, and place into the oven for 3-4 hours or until the lamb is tender. Alternatively, transfer the browned chops and aromatics to a slow cooker and cook on auto for 4-6 hours.

Once the lamb chops are tender, remove the bones and stir through the cream, almonds and baby spinach. Place into the oven or leave in the slow cooker for a final 30 minutes, then season to taste and serve.



Commonly asked - what is the difference between polarised and non-polarised lenses?

s we head into another winter, it's not surprising many of us retire our sunglasses for a few months. What you may not realise is, it's just as important to protect your eyes through the winter months as it is through summer. Just like our skin, UV radiation can harm our eyes, at any time of the year. While those levels are three times higher during summer, UV rays are around even in overcast wintry weather, so we recommend keeping your sunglasses on hand all year round!

There are many options available these days. Non-polarised/ UV tinted sunglasses will reduce the intensity of light reaching the eyes and provide protection from our harsh

For those who rely heavily on digital devices or a heads-up display unit in their vehicle, this would be an ideal choice, as polarised lenses can be a bit of a nuisance with the appearance of digital screens. Polarised sunglasses reduce the intensity of glare while blocking certain angles of light. These will give you the same amount of protection from UV rays as non-polarised sunglasses, but with the added bonus of glare reduction. Polarisation will allow for richer colours, starker contrast in shadows, and more clarity in your environment. It is not so much "better" for your eyes, but can be more comfortable in brighter conditions.

If you're into active sports that require a



quick reaction time, like mountain biking or trail running, a reflection can be a dangerous distraction. Compared to regular tinted sunglasses, polarised lenses will erase the shimmer and keep your tyres on the dirt. Fishing and boating are also among the hobbies where we would suggest the use of polarised lenses. This will allow you to see through the surface of the water rather than getting a reflection off it. Perfect for spotting that big catch of the day!



A mother of two and a business owner, Tara loves nothing more than supporting others to find success in business.

It's music to the ears of Tara, who hopes to grow the platform to reach even more women.

Listening to Pāpāmoa, pushing back on the 12 per cent

his April the Mayor and councillors hosted 17 events throughout the city, from classic town hall meetings to casual drop-in sessions at markets, to gather your feedback directly on the draft 2025/26 budget. Even though we represent different wards, we supported one another throughout. Thank you to all those who attended an event and to Mayor Mahé, Deputy Mayor Scoular, Cr Taylor and Cr Curach for joining me at my Pāpāmoa town hall meeting at the surf club a few weeks ago.


With a proposed 12 per cent rates rise in a challenging economic climate, I knew our community would push back - as it should. So before adopting the draft budget, I moved to form a working group consisting of the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor, senior staff and two councillors to identify an additional \$6.7 million in operational savings before setting the final budget in June. I am confident we can secure these targeted savings and reduce the increase in a meaningful way. High rates rises around New Zealand have been cited as a factor contributing to inflation rising slightly to 2.5 per cent, and Tauranga must do its part.

For wider context, last month's headlines focused on the new administration building on Devonport Road. It is undeniably striking and is an international showcase for timber construction, but it will be seen little by the public once the Council Chamber relocates to Willow Street, Conceived and initiated by the commissioners, the building will cost more than \$90 million in lease payments over the



next 15 years on top of a \$33 million fit-out that Council paid for. In my view, this and other lavish legacy projects locked in by the commissioners conflict with the Prime Minister's call for councils to return to basics. It also raises important questions about why the current government allowed the commission to continue for nine months after the election despite public warnings that commissioners were committing future elected councils to costly long-term projects.

A victory for Pāpāmoa's growing community

Recently we received exciting news for our community with the announcement that the eastbound off-ramp of the Pāpāmoa East Interchange will open ahead of schedule in the second half of 2025.

This isn't just another infrastructure announcement – it's the culmination of years of advocacy and a testament to what can be achieved when local voices are heard in Wellington.

Since before my election, I've been fighting for this project. The message from locals has been consistent and clear: we need better connections to support our rapidly growing community. Pāpāmoa is expected to grow to around 40,000 people by 2043, and our infrastructure needs to keep pace.

I've worked tirelessly behind the scenes, engaging directly with the Minister of Transport, NZTA officials, and Tauranga City Council to push this project forward. My persistent lobbying for an early opening of at least part of the interchange has finally paid off. The eastbound off-ramp represents a significant victory in this ongoing effort to secure better infrastructure for our region.

What does this mean for you and I as locals? For families in the Golden Sands and Wairākei neighbourhoods, it means shaving precious minutes off your commute. For businesses, it means improved accessibility and new opportunities for growth. For property owners, it means enhanced connectivity

that adds value to your investment.

But this is just the beginning. While the eastbound off-ramp will provide immediate relief, the full interchange project – scheduled for completion in mid-2026 – will transform how we move around our region. It will alleviate pressure on existing routes and enable further development.

Our Government's commitment to infrastructure extends beyond this single project. The recent green light for the Tauriko West Road of National Significance demonstrates our comprehensive approach to addressing the region's transport needs.

These aren't just roads and ramps – they're lifelines that connect communities, create jobs, and drive economic growth. Every minute saved in traffic is a minute that can be spent with family or growing a business.

I want to thank Transport Minister Chris Bishop, Tauranga City Council, and NZTA for their collaboration on making the early opening possible. I also want to thank every community member who shared their stories and concerns with me – your voices have been instrumental in moving this project forward.

Rest assured, I'll continue fighting for our region's infrastructure needs. This early opening is a win, but our work is far from over. The Bay of Plenty deserves world-class infrastructure, and I won't stop until we get it because I'm a local, just like you!





Pāpāmoa food Hub update The gift of nourishment PAPAMOA FOOD HUB



By Pāpāmoa Food Hub founder Bruce Banks utumn has arrived, and the demand for food support in Pāpāmoa is not slowing.

As the weather gets cooler, our food parcels are adapted to suit the season. The standard parcel is created for a family of four for a minimum of four days, and it can be adapted to suit larger families. That's breakfast, lunch, dinner and even dessert, plus some pantry staples and a few treats added for good measure. When available we try to add personal hygiene items and food for the cat or dog.

For all main meals we also include our own recipe cards, and all the ingredients to create a nutritious, healthy dinner that is also budget friendly. Many of our clients have found our recipe cards very useful and saved them so they can use them again and again.

Pāpāmoa Food Hub was created to offer short-term emergency food support, and that is exactly what we do. Where long-term issues are evident, we can often advise our clients where further help might be avail-

From what I have been told lately, it appears that far too many Pāpāmoa families are needing help but are too afraid or embarrassed to ask. Some of these are hard working families who have just hit a temporary bump in the road and need a bit of help to get through their struggle.

Some of the common reasons to need help from Pāpāmoa Food Hub include redundancy, unexpected medical or dental bills, a

bereavement, reduction in work hours or lack of work for the self-employed.

The hub is run almost entirely by volunteers and relies on local financial support. It does not receive any government funding but needs to apply to funders such as gaming trusts, with some success.

Working within our capacity means that we cannot always service everyone who applies for food support; our main priority is helping families.

Applications can be made via our website; make sure you supply all the information requested to be considered. Before applying, please read the conditions at the top of the

What's coming up in the next few months?

Our plan is taking shape to bring free cooking classes to Pāpāmoa families who could do with a little help in preparing healthy, nutritious and low-cost meals for the family. This is a great opportunity for a parent and teen/pre-teen child to learn to cook together. First classes are expected to start this school term

A message from your local doctor

ven in our sunny seaside town, the cooler weather is starting to roll in and it's a stark reminder that winter is just around the corner. I'm Dr. Dennis Docker, a GP at Tend Pāpāmoa, here to remind you that now is the time to prioritise your health.

Every winter, GP clinics get busier and wait times grow longer. This year, we remind you to take a proactive approach, come in early for your health checks and get your flu vaccine in one easy visit. And let's not forget that vaccines for COVID-19 remain available for everyone over the age of five and for children over six months with underlying health conditions.

Many people delay care until symptoms get worse, but prevention is key. My best advice is see your doctor regularly, before illness prevails.

Three simple ways to stay ahead of the winter bugs:

- Schedule annual check-ups around birthdays to keep the whole whanau on track.
- Use the Tend app to book appointments, order repeats, view test results and view your consultation notes.
- 3. Combine your visits by getting your flu shot during your health check-up. Just book both through the Tend app.

While some clinics have closed books, at Tend Pāpāmoa on 53 Domain Road, we're welcoming new patients and are here to keep you well this winter. Simply download the Tend app and enrol today.
